Since 2002, a group of dedicated parents has been working tirelessly to focus attention on the district's facilities and provide for an additional gym on the campus. Over this 14-year period, the bond has been presented on four separate election ballots but fell short of the 60 percent

### **LHS Receives 2015 Washington Achievement Award**

Liberty High School is a recipient of the 2015 Washington Achievement Award for Overall Excellence. This is an extraordinary accomplishment and is a direct reflection of the hard work of our students, the dedication of our teachers, and the support and guidance of our parents.

Liberty's award is well deserved. The <u>Washington Achievement Awards</u> are sponsored by the Washington State Board of Education and the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction. They celebrate Washington's top-performing schools and recognize achievement in many categories. This highly selective award is based on our school's performance on the <u>Washington State Achievement Index</u>.

The Washington Achievement Award is given in six categories: overall excellence, high progress, reading growth, math growth, graduation rate, and English language acquisition. The selection process for the Washington Achievement Award is very rigorous, and we take great pride in this accomplishment.

### **Highly Capable Program**

The enrollment period for Liberty's Highly Capable (HiCap) Program is now open. Parents, students, teachers, and community members may nominate individual students to be considered for the HiCap program. The Student Services Team will screen all nominees and may make recommendations for further testing. Data used to identify students will include classroom, school, and state assessments, report card grades, teacher recommendations, and finally a standardized ability test called the CogAT 7. Parents will be notified prior to administration of the CogAT 7 should your child be considered for ability testing.


